Camino de Santiago

The Camino de Santiago (the Way of St. James) is a large network of ancient pilgrim routes stretching across Europe and coming together at the tomb of St. James (Santiago in Spanish) in Santiago de Compostela in north-west Spain

2021 - CAMINO DE SANTIAGO HOLY YEAR

2021 is set to be a memorable year for pilgrims around the world as it is the next Holy Year on the Camino de Santiago. Celebrated whenever the Feast of St James (July 25) falls on a Sunday, the last one was in 2010, and pilgrims who walk the Camino in 2021 will be able to enter the Cathedral by the "Holy Door" which is only opened during that year.

Extending the Holy Year into 2022 following the Covid-19 Pandemic

Following the exceptional circumstances around the Covid-19 pandemic, Pope Francis has announced an extension to the Holy Year. This means that the Holy Door will remain open and pilgrims will be able to obtain forgiveness of their sins throughout 2022 also. This is great news, as it will allow anyone hoping to visit during the Holy Year added flexibility around their travel.

Origins of the pilgrimage

The history of the Camino de Santiago goes back at the beginning of the 9th century (year 814) moment of the discovery of the tomb of the apostle of the Iberian Peninsula. Since this discovery, Santiago de Compostela becomes a peregrination point of the entire European continent.

The Way was defined then by the net of Roman routes that joined the neuralgic points of the Peninsula. The impressive human flow towards Galicia made quickly appear lots of hospitals, churches, monasteries, abbeys and towns around the route. During the 14th century the pilgrimage began to decay, fact brought by the wars, the epidemics and the natural catastrophes.

The recovery of the route begins at the end of the 19th century, but it is during the last quarter of the 20th century when the authentic contemporary resurge of the peregrination takes place. There is no doubt that the social, tourist, cultural or sport components have had a great importance in the "jacobea" revitalization but we cannot forget

that the route has gained its prestige thanks to its spiritual value.

The Camino de Santiago, which corresponds to several routes in Spain and <u>France</u>, was declared in 1987 the first <u>Cultural Route of the Council of Europe</u>. Since 2013, the Camino de Santiago has attracted more than 200,000 pilgrims each year, with a growth rate of more than 10 percent per year. Pilgrims come mainly on foot and often from nearby cities requiring few days of walking to reach Santiago.

St. James

When Jesus called Peter, He also later called the Apostle John and James, and all three were fishermen. Jesus' intention was to make them "fishers of men." The disciples that Jesus called were likely not very popular in society, especially among the religious leaders, yet their occupation provided a critical need for the society as fish were staples among the residents in Judea. Even so, they were looked down upon by the Jewish leaders, the Roman authorities and even among the population in general. These were not refined, polished men with great speaking skills but were probably looked down upon as country bumpkins or ruffians since their hometown was Capernaum. They would have been on the low rung of society in that day, however God has a history of calling and using men and women who the world has little regard for and thinks very little of..

The Apostle James may have been the first apostle to die for his faith because he was one of the most outspoken and given the fact that King Herod killed James, it could have been James propensity to speak boldly for Christ and speak against the evil that King Herod was well known for. Either way, the Apostle James was completely changed...by the power of the Holy Spirit. He was impulsive, outspoken, easily provoked to anger, and highly impulsive and at one time had a so-called "hair trigger" but like John, who became known as "the apostle whom Jesus loved" (John 13:23), became a new creation in Christ (2 Cor 5:17) and was forever changed and today is one of the 12 apostles that will be ruling or judging the 12 tribes in Israel in the coming kingdom of God (Matt 19:28). That's who the Apostle James was.
